In 2006, Lindsey received a post graduate diploma in broadcast journalism from Seneca College at York University. She was the recipient of the award for best overall radio and television newscaster.

After completing her broadcast journalism diploma, Lindsey moved to Halifax and was hired by CTV Atlantic as a Reporter/Anchor. For several years, she reported the top stories of the Maritimes before returning to Toronto to work at CP24.

Lindsey is always up for the next adventure. She has both her scuba diving licence and her private pilot's licence. Passionate about the arts, Lindsey studied drama at Oxford University, England; at Rodean School in Johannesburg, South Africa; and at Circle in the Square Theater School in New York City. Sarah is the executive director of Outward Bound Canada (OBC), a not-for-profit, charitable educational organization that has run personal and leadership development programs in the outdoors for youth and adults for 44 years.

Outward Bound Canada runs wilderness and urban programs across the country with fifty percent of all participants receiving subsidization to attend their program. Outward Bound's core funded programs include experiences for women survivors of violence, veterans who have served Canada in combat zones, Aboriginal youth and low income/under resourced youth living in urban centres.

Sarah is a leadership consultant, educator and prior business owner who has been involved in experiential education initiatives and programs within Canada over the last 25 years. She began working for OBC in the early 1990s as an instructor, guiding outdoor leadership expeditions from coast to coast. She was the founding principal of Outward Bound Canada College (OBCC), an innovative residential high school which used a fully integrated model of curriculum delivery.

Prior to taking on the role of executive director at OBC, Sarah was the deputy head of operations at Shawnigan Lake School on Vancouver Island and, before that, she was the director of student life at Strathcona-Tweedsmuir School in Okotoks, Alberta.

Sarah has a M.B.A. with a specialization in leadership, an honors degree in political science, a teaching degree in outdoor and experiential education and a M.Ed. in curriculum and instruction.

Sarah has climbed some of the highest mountains in the world, competed in the Hawaii Ironman World Triathlon Championships, the EcoChallenge Adventure Racing Championships and numerous marathons.
