

AGESW Gerontological Social Work Pre-Dissertation Initiative

Project Co-Directors

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The Association for Gerontology Education in Social Work (AGESW), along with support from the Gerontological Association (GSA), will provide support for a cohort of ten social work doctoral students who have completed the first year of doctoral studies. The goal of this program is to support dissertation and career development in gerontological social work research and education. Recipients will receive more than ten hours of programming delivered by nationally recognized experts in gerontological social work research and teaching designed to prepare participants for an academic career in gerontological social work. The Program will be delivered at the 2013 Gerontological Society of America (GSA) conference in New Orleans. Awardees will be selected by the AGESW Pre-Dissertation Advisory Council.

Program Outcomes

Upon completion of participation in the AGESW Gerontological Social Work Pre-Dissertation Initiative, participants will have the skills necessary to:

- Prepare an application for financial support of their dissertation research in gerontology
- Develop a career plan that integrates their proposed teaching-scholarship
- Develop a course syllabus related to gerontological social work

Participant Benefits

- A \$1,000 stipend to attend the pre-conference AGE-SW Pre-Dissertation Initiative Training at the GSA Annual Meeting
- One-year membership to AGESW
- Registration for the GSA Annual Meeting
- One-year membership to GSA
- Ongoing mentoring from a member of AGESW
- Participation in a webinar on a topic to be determined by the cohort. Past topics have included job interview skills.

Program Eligibility

- Applicant must be enrolled in a social work doctoral program (full or part time) in the United States
- Applicant must not have <u>completed</u> more than two years of his/her doctoral program at the time of application (i.e., Pre-Dissertation stage, and not have submitted the dissertation proposal)

- Applicant must secure the sponsorship of a faculty member—commitment from a
 faculty member who has reviewed and supports the application, and who can
 attest to the applicant's qualifications and interest in gerontological social work
 research and/or education
- Applicant must secure institutional support—commitment from the Dean, Director or program administrator that the institution will support the applicant with a matching stipend (\$1,00)
- Multiple applicants from a given doctoral program may be selected

The Application

- Cover Sheet (see below)
- Applicant's Curriculum Vita
- A two-page single-spaced personal statement indicating 1) applicant's educational journey prior to entering the doctoral program, 2) interest in gerontological social work research and education and 3) career goals
- A letter of support from an institutional faculty sponsor
- A letter confirming institutional support from program director for attending the Annual Meeting of the Gerontological Society of America (GSA)

Applicants will be chosen based on the AGESW Advisory Council criteria:

Personal Statement [60%]
Letter of Support [20%]
Institutional Support [20%]
