Over 100 local business members gathered for the recent Security and Business Protection Faire & Mixer, earning the praise of Sheriff Scott Jones and Deputy Chief Sam Somers for taking the initiative to stop crime before it starts. "It's nice for us to be at an event where business people are proactive to strengthen security, rather than after an incident has occurred and everyone wants to know why," said Chief Somers.
