The **Nursery Tour** starts bright and early (7:30am) and will visit Mt. Cuba Center, W.D. Wells and Sons Water Crest Farms Nursery, The Conard Pyle Company and Ivy Acres. The **DuPont Legacy Tour** leaves an hour later at 8:30am and will visit Nemours Mansion and Gardens, Hagley Museum and Gardens and Mt. Cuba Center. Both tours will meet at the end of the day at North Creek Nurseries for a nursery tour and Ice Cream Social.

NURSERY TOUR:

• Mt. Cuba Center: Mt. Cuba Center is a non-profit horticultural institution in northern Delaware located on nearly 600 acres. They are dedicated to the study, conservation, and appreciation of plants native to the Appalachian Piedmont Region through garden display, education, and research. Of particular interest will be their newly renovated trial gardens. DUPONT LEGACY TOUR (registration limited to 53 people)

• Nemours Mansion and Gardens: Nemours is the spectacular 300-acre country estate of the late industrialist and philanthropist Alfred I. duPont. The gardens at Nemours are the finest example in North America of a formal French garden. We will enjoy a brief tour of a portion of the late-18th-century French style mansion and then tour the gardens. This garden is newly renovated in 2008 and offers a rare glimpse into the gardens and lifestyle of the duPont family. It is situated next to the nationally renowned A.I. duPont children's hospital founded by Mr. duPont. http://www.nemoursmansion.org/



• Hagley Museum and Gardens: Located on 235 acres along the banks of the Brandywine River in Wilmington, Delaware, Hagley is the site of the gunpowder works founded by E. I. du Pont in 1802. This example of early American industry includes restored mills, a workers' community, and the ancestral home and gardens of the duPont family. Some of the regions oldest champion trees reside here, including a 350 year old Osage Orange (Maclura pomifera) with a 23 foot circumference! http://www.hagley.lib.de.us/



• Mt. Cuba Center: Mt. Cuba Center is a non-profit horticultural institution in northern Delaware located on nearly 600 acres. They are dedicated to the study, conservation, and appreciation of plants native to the Appalachian Piedmont Region through garden display, education, and research. Their woodland wildflower gardens are recognized as the region's finest. Of particular interest will be their newly renovated trial gardens.
