GA Ford PAS Hub Update

For GCCAN June 2011 Newsletter

Approximately one year ago this month, Lt. Governor Casey Cagle welcomed several supporters of the Georgia College and Career Academy Network (GCCAN) to the State Capitol to thank them for their financial contribution to the program. Members of the Georgia Apartment Industry Education Foundation, representatives from AT&T, and associates from Georgia Power all gathered in the Lt. Governor's office to discuss on-going plans for GCCAN. These funds were to be used to assist college and career academies in receiving technical support from Georgia's Ford HUB, a partnership between Ford Motor Company Fund, TCSG, and the Georgia College and Career Academy Network. Five Georgia college and career academies received mini-grants (Douglas County College and Career Institute, Floyd County College and Career Academy, Hapeville Charter Career Academy, Houston County Career Academy, and Lanier Charter Career Academy) toward 3 full days of Ford PAS Next Generation Learning professional development. Each of these college and career academies completed their 3 days of workshops, with the exception of Douglas (which will host their 3rd day this fall), during the 2010-11 school year. This translates into 125 educators, both secondary and postsecondary from the Technical College System, receiving instruction on how to implement projectbased and inquiry-based learning using the Ford PAS resources.
