1. POLICY:

The Art Gallery and Décor Sub-committee reports to the Building and Grounds Committee reports to the Board Liaison – Member at Large for Building & Grounds.

Individuals may exhibit art for display and or sale in the Garden Room and at other designated places on church property with permission. Permission must be secured by written application to the B&G Committee. Displayed art must meet the following rules:

- 1. Art may not be displayed for more than its allotted display time as given on a schedule to be determined by the committee.
- 2. Displayed art as defined by this committee may include but is not limited to: paintings, crafts, handmade jewelry, ceramics and textiles.
- 3. Art must fit within the space allowed and not be heavier than the wall fittings can sustain.
- 4. Artists may apply for permission to display by contacting the Art Gallery and Decor Committee chairperson, who will send them a form to complete.
- 5. Art must comply with the goals and mission of the Northwoods UU Church. The B&G Committee has the right to deem any art inappropriate and remove it from display for return to the artist.
- 6. Art will be posted with a display card with the artist's name, either the sale price or "Not for Sale" (NSF), contact information, and a description of the work.
- 7. Artist is responsible for the sales transaction of the art with a minimum 20% of the sale price donated to the church.
- 8. Display space is NOT available to professional gallerys. Display space is available only to individual artists and preference will be given to artists that are members of the Northwoods Church.
- 9. Northwoods Unitarian Universalist Church is NOT responsible for any damage to the displayed art for any reason. Artists shall immediately remove artwork from Church premises at the end of the allotted display period.

The Art Gallery and Decor committee welcomes the open discussion of issues and ideas raised by the exhibited art works. Procedures for the educational resolution of differences in interpretation, opinion, and taste are in place as the committee focuses upon the open sharing of views and support for shared principles within our religious community. Any objections to displayed art should be brought to the Committee.
