Once Upon A Time in Carriacou

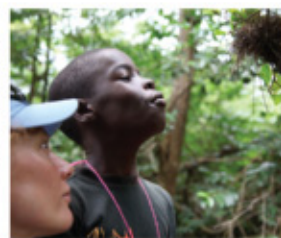
