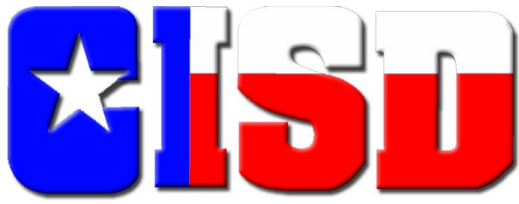

Crowley ISD is privileged to serve more than 15,000 students who benefit from a laser focus on excellence in education - academics, arts, athletics, and real-world applications.

Unprecedented community support is proudly provided by dedicated families, educators, corporations, and community leaders.

Academics:



- Advanced Academics participation has skyrocketed this year with 36% more students enrolled in Pre-AP, AP and dual credit courses.
- Dual credit enrollment has more than doubled with a new Tarrant County College partnership to offer courses at the Bill R. Johnson Career and Technology Education Center. From the CTE Center, TCC also educates the Crowley community at large.
- Pre-AP courses are now available starting in the 6th grade. AP courses are now available starting in the 9th grade.
- The Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) program has seen significant increase in enrollment, providing enriched instruction for qualifying K-12 students.
- NCHS Debate Team members are District Champs. All teams qualified for State.
- \$3.6 million in college scholarships were awarded to seniors of 2012.

Arts:



- More All-State Choir members attend NCHS than any other school in the state.
- The CHS Mighty Eagle Band has received 30 consecutive Superior Division 1 ratings at U.I.L. marching band competitions.
- The NCHS Mighty Panther Band has received 14 consecutive Superior Division 1 ratings. That is one for every year since the campus opened!
- Band is now available to 6th grade students for the first time.
- The acclaimed 5th and 6th grade CISD Honor Choir performs in prestigious venues, from the Majestic Theatre in Dallas to Carnegie Hall in New York City.

Athletics:



- NCHS Men's Basketball Team members are champions on the court, having lost only 7 games at home in 14 years and are enjoying a 72 game district winning streak.
- CHS Cross Country Team has qualified for Regionals 20 years in a row.
- CHS Varsity Cheerleaders were named National Champions in the non-tumbling division at the American Showdown Competition.
- NCHS Varsity Cheerleaders were awarded highest honor of All-Americans at NCA Summer Camp.
- CHS Girls 4 x 200 Relay Team is ranked 5th in the nation.

Real-world Applications:



- The Bill R. Johnson Career and Technology Education Center is serving 28% of CISD high school students with courses in 13 career pathways. This is the highest percentage of high school students served by any CTE program in Tarrant County.
- CISD students benefit from hands-on learning through partnerships with Huguley Memorial Medical Center, VLK Architects, Texas Restaurant Association, Crowley Police and Fire Departments, Dallas Fire and Rescue and others.
- The Sewell Agriculture Science Center is known and respected as one of the premier agricultural education centers in the state, serving more than 270 students.
- The CISD Corps of Cadets is the largest Army JROTC unit in the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex and 8th largest in the southwest region.
