Also included with the lease are 15 box blinds and feeders, which are already in place for your convenience. Very little prep time will be necessary to move in and begin hunting.

We Have The Permits

As many of you know by now, due to recent changes, in order to legally hunt scimitar-horned oryx, addax, and dama gazelle in the U.S., you must now hunt on a property that has two permits that are obtained through the USFWS. We recently received our permits for the H. Yturria properties in South Texas, and also have the permits that are allowed to hunt red lechwe. So, this large hunting property, which is a wildlife paradise, is one of the few places where you can now legally hunt these three species on the same hunt.

We will be re-opening our Yturria Camps on September 1, so feel free to give us a call if you would like to schedule your hunt for this fall. We have perhaps the largest herd of scimitar-horned oryx and red lechwe in the U.S., and one of the healthier, large herds of addax, as well. These hunts take place from very comfortable camps, designed to assimilate an African safari type of camp. We also have some of the finest nilgai antelope hunting on this planet, and hunt these big beasts on three divisions of Yturria properties, with a combined population in excess of 3,000 nilgai....yes, that is correct! This is a good off-season hunt, or you can perhaps also combine with a whitetail or turkey hunt. Give us a call if you'd like to discuss details and available dates.

Texas Free-Range Elk

Texas is not that well known for elk hunting, but there is a growing population of free-ranging elk in the desert mountains and hills of West Texas, and some very nice bulls have been coming from this area in recent years. Over the last several years, WSI has been conducting a few elk hunts in this region, generally offering 1-3 hunts a year, with average bulls being 6x6 bulls, typically scoring 300"-330", but we have taken bulls over 350".

This year, with commitments from our landowners a bit earlier in the year than normal, combined with expanded area on 3 different properties, we'll likely book 8 spots, with the majority of hunting taking place during the bugle season in late September and first half of October. These will be 4 day, 4 night programs, with meals, lodging, and guide. Unlike many elk hunts in some western states, these hunts take place in low altitude conditions, with little walking typically being required, so we can accommodate most any hunter. Weather is normally mild at that time, making this a very comfortable and convenient hunt to attend. We have this hunt set up as a base fee, plus trophy fee arrangement, which is also an attractive feature for the hunter. Call Greg for additional details.
