BOARD PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



What a year! 2012 was a very busy year for United Way and for Laramie County. Some groundbreaking work was completed this year making for more efficient use of your United Way dollars.

First of all, a team of volunteers from around Laramie County, headed by staff at Cheyenne Regional Medical Center, completed a full needs assessment for our area. The end result is a publication that clearly shows the needs that exist in our community and gives us benchmark information that can be used to see if our Community Programs are having an impact on the need. It also identifies areas of need that are not addressed by current programs. This document will be used by the Community Investment Teams as they determine how to

most effectively use the limited dollars available to fund the programs with the most potential to impact the most critical measures. A copy of this document can be found on our website. I definitely encourage you to take a look. It is sure to be an eye-opener.

The second major accomplishment implemented in 2012 was Goal Connect. This is a project that provides software to our Community Partners to allow a single point of client data entry and the ability to track clients as they move through the system. This will help us to identify barriers to accessing services, better understand the services that are needed and used by families in Laramie County and decrease the burden on those in need who would otherwise have to complete a client intake form at each program they visit. Like the Needs Assessment, this program will help to be sure that funds are used efficiently and in a manner that has the most positive impact on the community.

While work was completed on these major projects, life continued around us. Wyoming 2-1-1 is now available 24/7 to the community, an expansion on the great work they do connecting people to available services. Tim and Kathy Joannides completed their third and final year as Campaign Co-Chairs with Dr. Bob Prentice and Dr. Sandra Surbrugg. As always, the Community showed their commitment to those in need, even in times of economic uncertainty, as the campaign stayed level over the previous year. United Way continued on its path to increasing awareness using technology with the Quarterly e-news, an informative newsletter sent out quarterly via email. As I reflect on the accomplishments that were made in 2012, I feel so very fortunate to be a part of the Laramie County Community and a part of the United Way process. Thank you to all who gave of your financial and volunteer resources to make our community a better place to live, and moving us closer to our goal of "No One in Need".

Cheyenne Health and Wellness Center (CHWC) provided 10,715 medical visits

Of 690 hospital emergency room referrals, 251 established care at CHWC

556 crisis calls were responded to by Peak Wellness Center

CHWC provided 30% more than expected acute dental services and issued 61 dental cleaning vouchers

Wyoming 2-1-1, Inc.



2-1-1 is a no fee, confidential, information and referral line answered by trained specialists. These service experts have access to a database of community based organizations, government agencies and non-profits throughout the state of Wyoming.

Wyoming 2-1-1 began offering 24/7 service on November 1

1,442 Laramie County calls were answered with 1,631 referrals

355 Laramie County services are in the Wyoming 2-1-1 Community Resource Database

United Way of Laramie County also provided matching funds for three program partner training and board development projects and miscellaneous designations to program partners and other local charities.

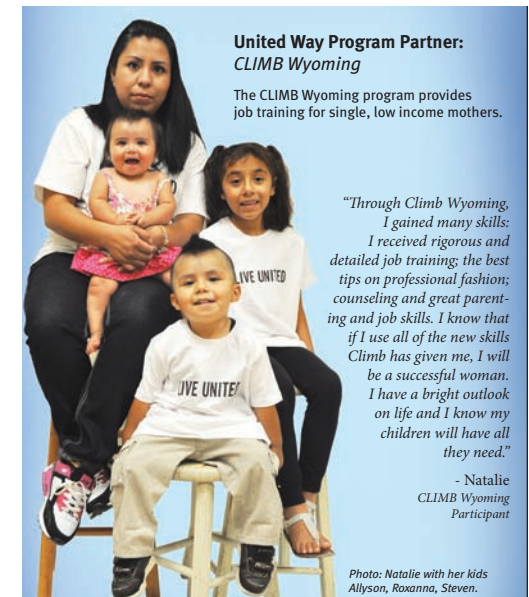
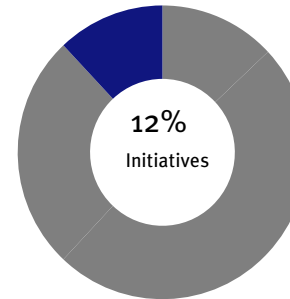
Wyoming Free Tax Service

The Wyoming Free Tax Service goal is to meet tax preparation needs for low income taxpayers. During the 2012 tax filing season (February - April 15) 533 low income taxpayers were served in Laramie County. This assistance provided them with \$217,522 in earned income tax credit (EITC); \$73,384 in child tax credit; and \$23,250 in education tax credit.

GoalConnect

GoalConnect will provide a system of care that benefits both Laramie County's underserved and the delivery of health care and social services in our community. This system will foster collaboration across a full range of human service and health care providers throughout our community.



Seven agencies made the commitment to be the first in Laramie County to utilize this new software and provide the resources necessary to participate in the initial project implementation that went live in December 2012. The seven agencies are: Cheyenne Regional Medical Center; Centralized Pharmacy; Cheyenne Health and Wellness Center; Peak Wellness Center; COMEA Shelter; Needs, Inc.; Adelante; and Circles Wyoming.


