



- Cheyenne Health and Wellness provided 2,196 uninsured residents medical care and 1,151 acute dental services

a full range of human service providers and health care providers throughout our community. The GoalConnect objectives are to:




Wyoming Free Tax Service

The Wyoming Free Tax Service goal is to meet tax preparation needs for low income taxpayers. During the 2011 tax filing season (February - April 16) 568 low income taxpayers were served in Laramie County. This assistance provided them with \$233,444 in earned income tax credit (EITC); \$85,895 in child tax credit; and \$\$24,656 in education tax credit.




