



## 2011 Impact Snapshot

- Cheyenne Health and Wellness provided 2,196 uninsured residents medical care and 1,151 acute dental services
- 82% of Meals on Wheels clients were able to stay in their homes
- 1,697 Centralized Pharmacy patients received prescriptions
- 228 Safehouse Services clients felt safe enough to stay in shelter for more than one week

a full range of human service providers and health care providers throughout our community. The GoalConnect objectives are to:


- Increase access to medical care for the uninsured/underinsured

## Wyoming Free Tax Service

The Wyoming Free Tax Service goal is to meet tax preparation needs for low income taxpayers. During the 2011 tax filing season (February - April 16) 568 low income taxpayers were served in Laramie County. This assistance provided them with \$233,444 in earned income tax credit (EITC); \$85,895 in child tax credit; and \$24,656 in education tax credit.




