

GEORGE A. RIOUX is presently the district director of the U.S. Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division's Boston Office. From 1974 to 1978 Mr. Rioux worked as an economist for the Bureau of Labor Statistics in Boston. In 1978 he transferred to the Wage and Hour Division and served as a Wage and Hour investigator in several offices throughout New England. Starting in August of 1990 Mr. Rioux served as the Regional Government Contract Wage Specialist for the Boston Region dealing exclusively with federally funded construction contracts and service contracts under the Davis Bacon and Related Acts or the McNamara O'Hara Service Contract Act. From October of 1990 to October of 1992 he served as the Assistant Regional Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division Boston Regional Office where he was responsible for administration and policy implementation of the regional office including its five district offices and three area offices located. Mr. Rioux currently serves as the President of the Federal Labor Managers Association which is one of the largest civilian chapters of the national Federal Labor Managers Association – all federal labor managers and supervisors from fourteen Department of Labor agencies throughout the country. Mr. Rioux has a BA in Economics from St. Francis College and Georgetown University and completed graduate work at Universite de la Sorbonne in Paris.
