Prichard Preparatory School field trip was a huge success!

Three days after it was published in the St. Paul's and Christ Church Cathedral's bulletins, and letters were mailed to family and other friends, I received in the mail enough donations to take the Prichard Preparatory students on their field trip! Holding an armful of envelopes, with my eyes brimming with tears, I gratitude became full of for everyone's enormous generosity. Thank you for the gifts you have given to the children. Also, thank for the kind notes of vou encouragement.

One of the many blessings that derived from my request was the idea to have a Veterans Assembly before the field trip to familiarize the students with the military. Four distinguished veterans from St. Paul's: Mr. Jim Moore, Mr. Bob Denniston, Mr. Suffich and Mr. Bill Hieter, plus a recently retired Veteran, Mr. Foster, who is a student's father, shared their stories and memorabilia with the children. This was followed by a reception honoring their service to our wonderful country.

The field trip began at the crack of dawn. Once the students were situated on the Colonial buses with breakfast bars and apple juice, a video about heroes began playing. The children were too excited to watch the movie.



We went the to National Barrancas Cemetery first. The students sang "The Pledge of Allegiance" and "God Bless America" at the pavilion before we began our tour. When our guides asked if there were any questions, Pandora's box opened wide, and out of the

mouths of babes every imaginable question about death and burials was asked! Then the students placed red roses on the graves of the unknown soldiers. Some classes spontaneously knelt in prayer before placing their flowers. The children were overwhelmed by the 4,000+ graves.

At the National Naval Aviation Museum they were overwhelmed again by how many planes were inside! They spent a couple of hours exploring and climbing in every plane that they were allowed. The pre-K students spotted some uniformed young men, who were there for a presentation and ran up to them wanting to know if they were real live soldiers! The soldiers got a big kick out of the children and insisted on having their photo taken together.

The weather was beautiful, so at noon we had a picnic on the grounds outside the Museum. During lunch, the new Commanding Officer, Capt. Keith Hoskins, and the Public Affairs Officer, Capt. Harry White, greeted the students and spent a long

time talking individually with them. The children were very impressed!

After lunch we headed back inside to the IMAX theater for the Blue Angels show. Although we weren't able to see them practice, it was the next best thing. With the booming sounds and the seven



story screen, the Blue Angels came to life. The third, fourth and fifth graders rode on the Blue Angel's simulator earlier, so they got a good idea how it felt to be in the cockpit.

All good things must come to an end, so after the show we headed back home. The children were exhausted, and the ride home was much quieter than the ride there. Arriving back at the school, they looked so cute sporting their new sailor hats as they unloaded from the bus.

It hardly seems fair that so many kind people helped to sponsor each child, but only a few chaperones got to witness the pure joy of watching children experience the this adventure. It was like watching a toddler with a new puppy! Thank you for your generous support and the precious gift of learning you have given to the Prichard Preparatory students! And it's not over yet! Your donations exceeded what was needed for this trip, so next year the PPS students will go to the Aquarium and Zoo in New Orleans!


Courtyard Columbarium

Enrollment continues for the Courtyard Columbarium, Phase I


Your check for \$3500 made payable to Christ Church Cathedral with the notation, Columbarium—Phase I will reserve your niche. Construction will begin when 35 niches have been purchased. Each niche holds two sets of cremains.

A courtyard columbarium has been designed to meet the needs of our Cathedral family. Located in the garden area between the Office/ Rectory and the Brantley/Huger Houses on Conception Street.

A fountain and benches will create peaceful space for family and friends. We envision it as a place for quiet and reflection, where loved ones can gather for prayer and remembrance.



The construction goal is 35.




WE THANK THOSE WHO HAVE RESERVED THEIR NICHES!

Options

- 1) Columbarium double niches are available in Phase I for \$3,500. The cost includes engraving on the granite face of the niche.
- 2) In the same area, "green" interment is available for those wishing their cremains be buried in the garden. An engraved granite plaque will be placed on the Chapter House wall that faces the garden and will be available for \$1,000.
- 3) For those whose cremains rest elsewhere, a granite plaque where names may be engraved will also be placed on the garden wall of the Chapter House at a cost of \$1,000.

From the Archives




The history of our Church in Mobile goes back to the days of British occupation when the English Chaplain held services in Fort Charlotte. In 1822 a Church was built just outside of the gates of the Fort, and the congregation organized as a congregation of the Church of England, though members of all Protestant Communions worshipped in this, the first non-Roman Catholic Church in the city of Mobile.

There is some confusion regarding the history of the early years of Christ Church. In one of the early records, the Rev. Samuel S. Lewis makes the statement that Christ Church was not fully organized as a Protestant Episcopal Church until 1835, the year in which he became rector. But early records of the Vestry show that the parish was organized and known as Christ Church in 1828, and admitted to union into the Diocese in 1830. The Rev. Joseph L. Tucker, D.D., who left a number of historical sketches, mentions the Rev. Norman Pinney as the first rector, and give as his dates 1830-34. But early Vestry records show that while the Rev. Murdoch Murphy, a Presbyterian, had charge of the church, though possible not as rector, until 1828, presiding at the Annual Meeting held April 12th, 1830, the Vestry later accepting his resignation in 1831. These same records show that the Rev. Norman Pinney was elected Rector in April of 1835, resigning in November of the same year, making him thus the second, and not the first rector of Christ Church. From Mr. Pinney's time on, the records are reasonable clear and accurate.

3. PRAYER CARD MINISTRY

- cards and/or handwritten notes to parishioners in pastoral need (life transitions, illness, hospitalization, nursing facility care, bereavement)
- personalized and signed on behalf of the Cathedral family, assuring them of our prayers for their wellbeing and our love

4. BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

- hospitality and support to grieving families gathered at the church for visitation and funeral
- support to family and friends through meals, assistance, etc.

5. CARING FRIENDS MINISTRY

- loving care for those who due to age or illness cannot always be with us in the Body, to remind them of their importance to our community
- visits, cards, flowers, etc.
- special gestures during Advent and Lent, as reminders of our love and prayers
- "shepherds" assigned to individuals to check in with them regularly

6. FLOWER MINISTRY

- arranges and delivers flowers each week to those with pastoral care needs--to those in hospitals or nursing care facilities, or who are ill, homebound, or bereaved
- card enclosed with flowers letting them know of the prayers and love of the Cathedral family

7. LAY EUCHARISTIC VISITORS

- visits each week to those who are unable to attend our worship together, taking them the Eucharist, as well as the prayers and love of the Cathedral family
- this ministry requires licensing through the Diocese and works directly with the clergy.

In the weeks ahead, we will be contacting those who have signed up and will be organizing and designating leadership roles. As we move into the summer months, we hope to have all of these ministries up and running.
