Our young people will begin their Sunday School classes that day by meeting their teachers. Our Cathedral music ministries will be showcased that day, with special offerings by the adult and hand bell choirs. We will also lift up the wonderful year of musical programs planned by Peggy Lyden, Cathedral organist and choirmaster. The Episcopal Church Women (ECW) will meet and sign up for ministries.

Altar and Flower Guilds, Ushers, and Acolytes will begin looking to the year ahead. Group gatherings of all sorts for all ages will begin. Our Episcopal Youth Community (EYC) will be collaborating in a new, shared experience with other groups from Mobile Episcopal parishes. Morning Circle, Younger Women's Bible Study, Mothers of Young Children, and the Cathedral Read book group will begin again. Daughters of the King (DOK) and the Brotherhood of St. Andrew will continue their ministries. Wednesday Noon Eucharist will resume on September 4, and a Brown Bag Bible Study will follow beginning September 11. A Dean's Forum will meet in the Chapel on designated Sundays throughout the year as a time for conversation about various Cathedral ministries.

There is much to do in the year ahead and many ways for our Cathedral family to grow and for each of us to find new opportunities for servant ministry. Please pray for all those who have already answered the call to serve—and for those who may be seeking new ways to be a part of our life together. These are not just jobs or activities. They are the way we live out our being as the Body of Christ and answer His call to mission.

Youth and their parents will meet their teachers on Rally Day

Sunday, September 8

The Children's Chapel Crucifer will lead the group from church before the procession begins.

Nursery—Age 3 and under if there is interest, will meet in the back nursery in the undercroft, downstairs below the Chapel. We will work with our young families to design a class based on the nursery curriculum for *Living the Good News*.

For children who will not be in the Christian Formation class, Deidre and Joe Williamson will be in the Nursery from before Church until after Sunday School dismisses.

Elementary—**Grades K, 1, 2** will meet upstairs in the large central room.

FUN Club—Grades 3, 4, 5 will meet upstairs in the second room on the left.

Both Elementary and Fun Club will use a new program for us called *Feasting on the Word: Teaching the Revised Common Lectionary.* This curriculum helps classes explore one of the lectionary passages in ways suitable for all participants. It provides comprehensive, accessible biblical background for teachers from four perspectives. The program was created to invite leaders and learners deeper into the rhythm of the church year.

Middle School—Grades 6, 7, 8 will meet upstairs in the first room on the left, the room with the big round window. They will use a curriculum that was developed and written exclusively for the Episcopal Church. It's entitled *Weaving God's Promises* after the process of faith formation in which we learn how God's promises of salvation are inextricably woven into our lives. The goal of *Weaving God's Promises* is to teach children the way of Christ, not only in the church but also in the world, and to give them a solid grounding for future youth formation programs, which in turn will prepare them for Christian adulthood.

Youth Confirmation—Grade 6 and up will meet once a month in a space determined by the size of the group. See next page for more details. ==>

High School—Grades 9, 10, 11, 12 will meet in the Brantley House and will return to a lectionary based curriculum, Feasting on the Word for Youth. Youth are figuring out who they are as they search for whose they are. Feasting on the Word materials provide opportunities for this age group to explore their personal and communal identity in Jesus Christ through meaningful community-building experiences, engaging Bible study, and relevant learning activities. Youth will be challenged to put their faith into action as they grow to understand themselves as Christ's disciples. Each session includes a media connection section that ties the week's scripture passage to a film, video, song, or website.

Dean's Forum—On three Sunday mornings in the fall and three Sunday mornings in the spring, an Adult Christian Formation Class will consider our mission and ministry together here at Christ Church Cathedral. The discussions will be led by Dean-elect Gibson. The topics for the discussion will be publicized monthly. The sessions will be held in the Chapel.

YOUTH CONFIRMATION

(grade 6 and up)

Meeting—Sunday, September 15 at 11:15 a.m. in the chapel for the youth and their families.

The class will meet one Sunday a month separately from their regular Sunday school class.

The curriculum will again be I Will God's Help. This with confirmation program, developed the help of Episcopal with educators, clergy and theologians, encourages youth to enter into a Episcopal—yet uniquely profoundly Christian—faith journey. It is built entirely on the Baptismal Covenant from The Book of Common Prayer, offers seekers a solid reflection on Episcopal heritage and belief, together with the riches of Episcopal liturgy and prayer.

The path to joining the Episcopal Church is through the laying on of hands by a bishop, or, as it is better known, confirmation. At Christ Church Cathedral, Mobile, we confirm our youth generally in the 6th grade. Our bishop, the Right Reverend Philip Duncan, is scheduled for the 9th Annual Cathedral Celebration on Sunday, May 11, 2014.

How to Join the Episcopal Church

If you would like to be on our parish register, as well as on the mailing list, please call the Cathedral office. We will request your letter of transfer from your previous parish, if you are an Episcopalian. If you would like to be received or confirmed in the Episcopal Church, please speak with Canon Gibson.

On membership in the Episcopal Church:

Canon 17:

Section 2 (a) All members of this Church who have received Holy Communion in this Church at least three times during the preceding year are to be considered communicants of this Church.

Section 2 (b) For the purposes of statistical consistency throughout the Church, communicants sixteen years of age and over are to be considered adult communicants.

Section 3. All communicants of this Church who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, are to be considered communicants in good standing.

Section 4. (a) A member of this Church removing from the congregation in which that person's membership is recorded shall procure a certificate of membership indicating that that person is recorded as a member (or adult member) of this Church...

(b) The Member of the Clergy in charge or Warden of the congregation to which such certificate is surrendered shall record in the parish register the information contained on the presented certificate of membership, and then notify the Member of the Clergy in charge or Warden of the congregation which issued the certificate that the person has been duly recorded as a member of the new congregation.


Anglican-Roman Catholic Dialogue
