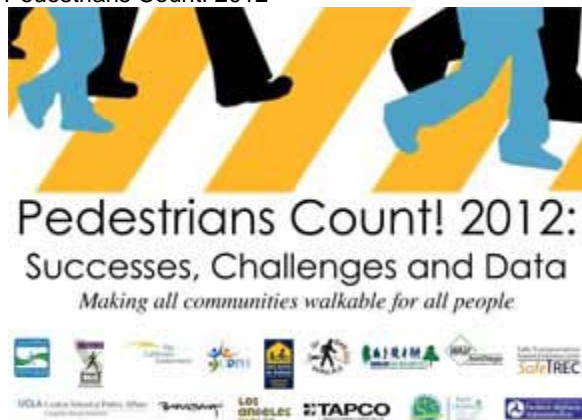

It was the second California pedestrian data workshop, the previous one, Pedestrians Count! Data, Modeling, and Advocacy Workshop, was held in 2010.

Pedestrians Count! 2012 brought together practitioners, advocates, agency officials and other stakeholders to discuss transportation policy, planning, implementation and other issues in the context of increasing awareness of knowledge of pedestrian volume, behavior, and other indices that can be used to make transportation and land use policies and practices more supportive of walking.
