New Hope Sidetracks Art Gallery proudly announces its Sixth Annual *Naked in New Hope* exhibition, a major group show celebrating the facts and foibles of the human body; beginning with Opening Receptions on Saturday and Sunday evenings, September 15 and 16, 2012 and extending through November 3, 2012. On Saturday evening, from 6 to 9 PM, as in previous years, the portion of Stockton Avenue directly in front of the Gallery will be closed to traffic during the reception for the safety of the opening night crowd, and to provide space for outdoor refreshments and conversation. As in 2011, there will be two venues on Stockton Avenue: the usual Sidetracks Gallery and an annex next door on the first floor of New Hope Arts.

Special for this Sixth Annual show, in cooperation with The Raven, a third venue at New Hope Lodge, 400 West Bridge Street, will function as a *Naked in New Hope* extension; because of the great increase in the number of participating artists. A second Opening Reception will take place there on Sunday, September 16, from 5 to 9 PM.

Headlining *Naked in New Hope* this year is the work of three principal artists: architectural sculptor Larry Wood; painter and teacher Gary Paul Stutler of Vallejo, California; and painter and ceramicist William B. Hogan of Lower Makefield, Pennsylvania.

Eighty-nine other artists will participate — fourteen Sidetracks Gallery Resident Artists, as well as guest artists both from Bucks County and from other parts of the nation. In addition to Wood, Stutler and Hogan, twenty-seven additional artists are showing at Sidetracks for the first time. Sculptures in stainless steel, bronze, copper. terra cotta, ceramic and wood will be on display. Other media on view at *Naked in New Hope* range from oil and acrylic to pastel, charcoal to pencil, water-color to photography, collage to pen and ink, etchings to mezzotints, egg tempera to mixed media on paper, hand-sewn embossed paper to watercolors with feathers in jelly jars.

Sculptor Larry Wood of Wyalusing, Pennsylvania, spent thirty years drifting (in his own words) "in ignorance and darkness, learning to be a lover a worker a husband and a father." The work alluded to encompassed major achievements in architectural metalwork, woodwork and stonework.

A man both private and concisely revealing, he continues, "Back then I was too serious to be an artist also. I am now those things and no longer too serious to be an artist. I spent the last 30 years taking it in. I'll spend the next 30 years spewing it out."

Sidetracks Gallery is delighted to present a large selection of Woods' "Stripworks" from 2011 and 2012, combining imagery of the human body with large strips of stainless steel (a few set in bronze) and of copper – ranging from 24 to 92" in length and 4 to 24" in width. The works will be installed in all 3 venues for the *Naked in New Hope* show.

In June, 2012, California painter Gary Paul Stutler was featured in a solo show entitled "Naked Men" at Manhattan's Phoenix Gallery in Chelsea. There he was honored with the purchase of one particular work for the permanent collection of the Leslie Lohman Museum of Gay and Lesbian Art.

An ad campaign for this show in ArtNEWS and in Advocate magazines brought his work to Sidetracks' attention. With the artist's cooperation, a selection of large charcoal and conte drawings from the Manhattan show will be highlighted at *Naked in New Hope*, with the artist and his partner on hand for the opening celebration.

Gary is an MFA graduate of the University of California-Davis, and continues an academic art career as teacher of anatomy, as well as pursuing his studio career in painting and drawing.

His work has been widely exhibited in California and on the East Coast in Manhattan, Brooklyn, New Jersey and Connecticut; and has been included in traveling exhibitions throughout the US, Europe and Australia-New Zealand. On line, he has been accepted into several major juried art exhibits.

Gary states he believes more "in making marks on a surface than words on a page." *Naked in New Hope* will help to make this evident to our local arts community.

Local artist William B. Hogan exhibits for the first time at Sidetracks with a large selection of his unique basrelief clay tablets. Dreamlike and surreal in his imagery, Hogan says he takes "my conscious and unconscious experience [to] create my visual language by following my bliss."

A native of Tenafly, New Jersey, William first refined his early interest in cartooning at the School of Visual Arts in New York City. Later drafted into military service and stationed in San Antonio, he steeped his craft in the colors and sights of the Southwest. After earning an MFA at the University of the Americas in Mexico City and after a stint of teaching school in New Mexico, he landed back in New Jersey for several happy years as an editorial cartoonist for "The Record."

All that experience has now become available for painting, pen and ink drawing and works in clay in nearby Lower Makefield, Pennsylvania, where Willliam lives with his artist wife Susan – a participant in *Naked in New Hope* both last year and this.
