Northampton Community College's Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) education is a comprehensive course that prepares participants to take the Pennsylvania Department of Health's exam to be certified as an Emergency Medical Responder (First Responder). State and Local exams will be offered upon successful completion of the course. The EMR program is offered at the Fowler Family Southside Center in March and October.



Course Structure

The course consists of clinical, lecture and testing. Participants are also required to attend mandatory testing sessions held on Saturdays from 9am-4pm. **There is no absenteeism allowed for the duration of the course.**

Requirements for Enrollment

Must be completed prior to the registration session. All forms are available at www.northampton.edu/ems.

- Must be at least 16 years of age to attend class.
- Read and review the EMR Functional Position Description. This document identifies the minimum qualifications, expectations, competencies and tasks expected of the EMR.
- Completed Pennsylvania Criminal Background Check (dated less than one year through class completion date).
- Completed PA Dept. of Health Criminal History or Disciplinary Action Reporting Form for Certification or Recognition.
- Review EMR student handbook and sign EMR Program Student Agreement form.
- Completed Student Information form.
- Completed Certification of Eligibility form.
- Completed Accommodation Request form.
- If under the age of 18, you must complete the Parental Consent form.
- Completed Insurance Coverage Information.
- Completed Student Emergency Contact form.
- Review and sign Local & State Testing schedule.
- Completed Photography Release form.
- Review and complete the Learning Channel document.
- Bring the following items to the first class: pocket mask, textbook: AAOS 5th Edition "First Responder: Your First Response in Emergency Care"*, uniform: navy shirt & navy pants and watch with a second hand.

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You must bring all completed documents to the registration session.

Participants cannot register prior to the mandatory information session.
