Florrie Burke, M.Ed., MA, LMFT

Emeritus Chair, Freedom Network USA

A highly-honored international HT
consultant, Florrie Burke initiated the
Anti-Trafficking Program at Safe Horizon
in New York City, where she oversaw
both the Anti-Trafficking Program and
the Solace Program for survivors of
torture. Presently, Ms. Burke serves
on the NY Anti-Trafficking Network
steering committee. Ms. Burke is an
expert witness on HT and modern-day
slavery cases; she is a member of the
Global Training Initiative on HT at the
UNODC, Vienna, and on three working
groups developing HT materials for first
responders. Ms. Burke has championed
trafficked persons since 1997, when she
crafted specialized social services for
60 deaf Mexicans held in slavery in a
NYC peddling ring. In 2007, Ms. Burke
received the U.S. DOJ's National Crime
Victims Recognition Service Award.

The Rev. Noelle Damico

Presbyterian Hunger Program,
Presbyterian Church (USA)

The Rev. Noelle Damico is national
staff for the Presbyterian Church

(USA), a 2.1-million member Protestant
denomination. Since 2002, she has
helmed the PC(USA) Campaign for
Fair Food, advancing human rights for
farmworkers and socially-responsible
purchasing in the food industry. Rev.
Damico also serves on the PC(USA) HT
roundtable, coordinates HT awareness
trainings for the PC(USA), and articulates
the church's rights-based approach to
addressing modern-day slavery.

A keynote panelist at the U.S. DOJ's
National Conference on HT in May 2010,
Rev. Damico reviewed a 2011 HT white
paper for the Organisation for Security
and Cooperation in Europe, and in April
2012 keynoted on human rights at the
United Nations' NGO Working Group on
Food and Hunger Policy. Additionally,
she has guest-lectured at Harvard,
NYU Stern School of Business, Union
Theological Seminary, University of
Chicago, and University of Virginia.

Maria Jose T. Fletcher

Freedom Network Training Institute &
Co-Director, VIDA Legal Assistance

Maria Jose T. Fletcher is co-director and
founder of VIDA Legal Assistance, Inc.,
a non-profit that advances the rights
of immigrant survivors of domestic
violence, sexual assault, trafficking in
persons, and other violent crimes. In
2011, VIDA received the Coordinated
Community Response Award for
outstanding service to immigrant victims
of domestic violence and sexual assault
in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

As attorney and advocate, Ms. Fletcher
is active in local, state, and national
domestic violence and victims' rights
organizations. She conducts educational
training about immigration, abuse, and
trafficking in persons in the U.S. and
abroad. She has presented at seminars,
conferences, and workshops by the U.S.
Dept. of State, the U.S. DOJ, including
the Office on Violence Against Women,
and by NGOs globally to address the
needs of immigrant survivors.

Recently, Ms. Fletcher completed a two-

year term on the 15-member National
Advisory Committee on Violence
Against Women, chartered by the U.S.
Attorney General. On November 30,
2012, the committee's report — formal
recommendations on the prevention of
domestic violence, to the U.S. DOJ and
U.S. Dept. of HHS — was released.

Laura Germino, MA

Freedom Network Training Institute &
Anti-Slavery Campaign Coordinator,
Coalition of Immokalee Workers (CIW)

Laura Germino is the Anti-Slavery
Campaign Coordinator for the Coalition
of Immokalee Workers, a community
organization of 5,000-plus migrant
farmworkers in Florida, "ground zero
for modern slavery." Since 1993, the
CIW and Ms. Germino have targeted
numerous violent, multi-state slavery
operations in the agricultural industry
across the southeastern U.S., liberating
over 1,200 captive workers and yielding
multiple successful federal prosecutions
of operational ringleaders. Ms. Germino
trains NGOs and law enforcement
agencies on identifying and curtailing
modern-day slavery operations. For the
Florida Dept. of Law Enforcement, she
developed the Advanced Investigative
Techniques in HT curriculum, and
contributed to the National Sheriffs'
Association guidebook on first-
response to crime victims. Nationally
and overseas, she presents on forced
labor, including at the OSCE's technical
seminar (Vienna) on agricultural labor
trafficking, and the 15th World Congress
on Criminology (Barcelona). In addition
to a commendation letter from FBI
Director Robert Mueller, Ms. Germino
was honored with a TIP Hero Award
by Secretary of State Hillary Clinton in
2010 for "perseverance against slavery
operations in the U.S. agricultural
industry" and "determination to
eliminate forced labor in supply chains."
