On January 14, 2013, came the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by Andrea J. Hinerman, Office of Disciplinary Counsel, and presented to the Court its statement of charges in the above-captioned matter. Thereafter, on April 16, 2013, came the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by its counsel, presented to the Court its petition praying for the Court to accept the annulment of the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, W. Kendrick King, and the formal affidavit, under seal, of the respondent consenting to voluntary disbarment.
