Based on the use of the START (Simple Triage And Rapid Treatment) algorithm for adults and the JumpSTART algorithm for children, the course teaches individuals how to effectively and efficiently assign a triage category to MCI patients using guidelines based on changes in vital signs. ### **San Francisco General Hospital - Asiana Airlines Accident Update**

In March 2012, the communications department at San Francisco General Hospital established a website to provide public health information and updates in the event of a disaster. On July 8, 2013, the first post to the page was made to provide a hospital-centered update of the Asiana Airlines accident at San Francisco International Airport two days prior. The informative post contains patient numbers, daily timelines, and a schedule for the next update. Next to the post, the website also contains SFGH tweets related to the incident. Through this transparent website, SFGH is able to directly and continuously provide community members with accurate and useful information pertaining to the incident.
