

# ABOUT ENERGY UPGRADE CALIFORNIA AND THE HERO FINANCING PROGRAM

## **Energy Upgrade California**

Energy Upgrade California is your one-stop-shop for up to \$4,000 in utility incentives for qualifying home improvement projects that can lower your energy bills, make your home healthier and more comfortable, and conserve water, energy, and natural resources.

Your first step is to select an Energy Upgrade California participating contractor you'd like to work with to plan the project that is right for your home and your budget. These participating contractors can walk you through the process, coordinate and complete the work, and help you receive an incentive.

## **Home Energy Renovation Opportunity (HERO)**

Homeowners may also qualify for the Home Energy Renovation Opportunity, or HERO financing program, offered by the Western Riverside Council of Governments. The HERO program provides low-interest financing for eligible energy and water efficiency projects and renewable energy products like solar systems.

Unlike traditional financing, HERO loans are added to the property as an assessment. Loan payments are included as part of the home's property tax bill. That means that the loan remains with the home even if the home is sold and that credit history is not a criteria for qualification.

Homeowners can apply for HERO financing whether or not they are taking advantage of the Energy Upgrade California program.
