

Chamber of Commerce report on the Regular Council Meeting June 10th, 2013:

- Staff Sergeant Tom Roy provided the May detachment report.
- Administration Report 59/13
Motion by Councillor Soles, second by Councillor Dolan to approve the recommendation that development variance permit application number 1302 be approved to permit the placement of an existing accessory building (Secondary Dwelling Unit) to be sited in front of the new proposed principal residence and to allow for a 147 m² secondary dwelling unit on the property located at 8 Radar Road. Carried.
- Correspondence:
 - Email Poll on the Bucket Truck for ratification – Motion by Councillor Dolan, second by Councillor Vigeant – Carried
 - Emergency Water Treatment and Evacuation Plans – for ratification – motion by Councillor Dolan, second by Councillor Eglinski – Carried
 - Councillor Eglinski motioned that a mock drill be carried out in Sept 2014, second by Councillor Osbourne. Carried
- Additions to the agenda –
 - Administration Report 61/13: Recommendation that a request for proposals be issued for the Development of an Asset Management System in whole and in part(s) of the following categories: Overall Project Management, Water, Wastewater and Storm and Facilities (incl Buildings, Fleet and Equipment). Motion to approve the recommendation by Councillor Vigeant, second by Councillor Eglinski – Carried
 - Administration Report 62/13 – Recommendation that the Contract for 2013 Community Trail and Sidewalk Extensions be awarded to DGS for the contract amount of \$657,739.18 plus tax and that optional enhancement work be pursued. Motion to approve the recommendation by Councillor Vigeant, second by Councillor Dolan – Carried.
 - Administration Report 63/13 – Recommendation 1 that the offer from Bird Construction for phase 3 of the Recreation Centre in the amount of \$31,061,175 be accepted as submitted. No motion was made and Recommendation 1 was not endorsed.
Motion by Councillor Vigeant, second by Councillor McKee to approve recommendation 2 that the propane to natural gas conversion item be removed from the tender and that the adjusted offer from Bird in the amount of \$ 30,518,175 be approved – Carried
 - Discussion was held on having a conversion to propane available for heat at the recreation centre if there should be a loss of natural gas. Staff was requested to look at possibilities and costs.
 - Animal Control Contract – Concerns regarding the hours of work and whether the current contract meets the community's needs. Motion by Councillor Eglinski for Council to review the contract and bring it back for discussion at the June 24th meeting. Second by Councillor Dolan. Carried.

- Traffic Control Bylaw regarding the parking of travel trailers etc. on residential roads. Concern expressed regarding a ticket received by a resident. Council requested a reminder to staff that this year should be an educational period and soft enforcement should include one warning prior to a ticket being issued.
- Petition by the Recreation Centre – Request that Mayor & Council participate in Canada Day. Two judges are needed for judging floats and cake servers are also required. Mayor Streeper and several Councillors will be available.
- Referendum Results: Ross Coupe reported that the final results are: 751 Yes; 78 No and 5 rejected ballots.
- Discussion regarding the Alaska Highway Corridor Study. Motion by Councillor Eglinski to provide the study in its draft form to the public ensuring that it is clearly marked draft and not endorsed by Council. Second by Councillor Soles - Carried
