Jay is also researching the story of two expeditions to Fort Nelson to do geographical and economic surveys of northeastern BC in 1913 and 1914. One expedition was headed by BC land surveyor G. B. Milligan, the other by adventurer (and scoundrel) E. B. Hart. Milligan kept a detailed diary and took photographs while Hart wrote letters and took some pictures. Both groups spent the winter of 1913-14 in Fort Nelson. Artifacts collected by Hart are in the National Museum of the American Indian in New York City. Some photographs from the trip are in the BC Archives.
