# Leadership in Action Award recipient for 2011

presented at the annual Healthy Minds Luncheon

CHRIS VAN GORDER, FACHE, President and Chief Executive Officer of Scripps Health, will be honored for his commitment to mental health care and awareness, both within the health care setting and on-scene, following disaster or crisis. In addition to his work at Scripps, Chris serves as Commissioner for the Emergency Medical Services Authority where he is involved with pre-hospital behavioral emergencies. He is also an instructor with the Red Cross and leads the San Diego Sheriff's Department Search & Rescue Unit, always cognizant of critical incident stress. When Scripps Health medical response teams are deployed to provide care and support following disasters like Hurricane Katrina, the Haiti earthquake, and the 2007 San Diego wildfires, he ensures mental health care is included as part of the response. Chris also understands that mental health care isn't always about crisis. In his tenure at Scripps Health, he has been a strong advocate for behavioral health care in the community and has helped the system's innovative supported-employment program—A-Visions—expand to help more than 100 patients find their way to greater working independence.

The plan envisions providing permanent housing and supportive services for the chronic homeless, many of whom have a mental illness.
