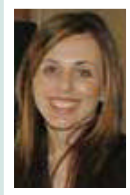

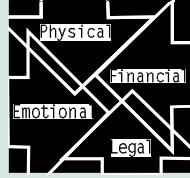

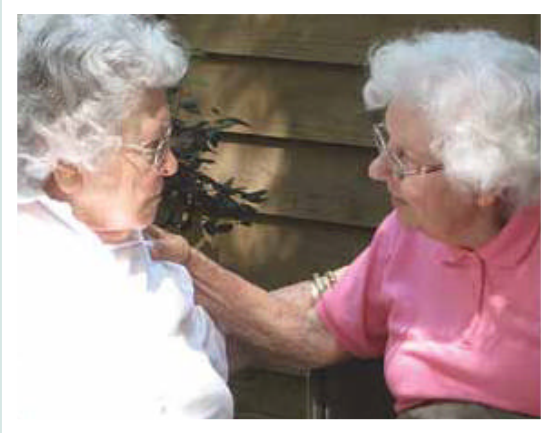

Objectives:

5. Identify underlying emotions related to the caregiving experience of clients with Alzheimer's diagnosis.
6. Identify the role of family members in the caregiving process.
7. Describe coping strategies and safety issues from the viewpoint of the caregiver.
8. Discuss ethical issues related to accessing benefits.
9. Identify the initial steps needed to determine current financial status, and needs for specific resources.
10. Discuss the options available based on income and asset allocation.
11. Identify the financially related legal issues related to health benefits, income benefits for care and income benefits for caregivers.
12. Identify resources and benefits related to the client's insurance.
13. Explain the role of Guardianship and Conservatorship from the probate court perspective.
14. Describe the Medicaid planning process through probate court.
15. Identify legal concerns for families caring for a family member with an Alzheimer's diagnosis.
16. Discuss the legal competency issues facing families caring for a family member with Alzheimer's diagnosis.
17. Discuss the importance of estate planning.
18. Describe the need for Wills and Trusts for persons with dementia.
19. Describe when a dementia patient and caregiver needs a Durable Power of Attorney, Patient Advocate and Trusts for persons with dementia.
20. Examine the evidence for prevention of Alzheimer's Disease.
21. Explore methods to enhance active engagement of the person with Alzheimer's Disease in their treatment.

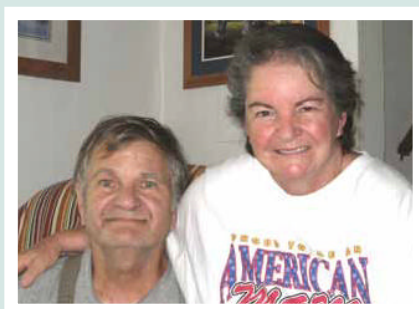
