Session One: Saturday, January 8th

Assignment One: Write a 6-8 page paper (double space) comparing and contrasting two of the four historical streams. Example, Evangelical Vs. Congregational, or German Reformed Vs. Christian historical stream. Cover things like- covenant theology vs. confessional theology, history, key figures, sacraments, polity, and impetus for the movement. You may want to use your home church historical origins as one of the streams...then compare/contrast with one your less familiar with.

## Assignment Two:

Part A-write 3-4 pages (double spaced) on the founding of the United Church of Christ. Why was the UCC formed and what was its hope and mission?

Part B –write 3-4 pages (double space) identifying and briefly describe one or two theological movements and hidden histories in the United Church of Christ since 1957.

(Example) American Indian, Chinese Congregationalism, LGBT, Liberation theology, Feminist theology, etc. You may want to cover something that interests you.

Part C – write 1-2 page reflection on your appreciation for the History and Theologies of the United Church of Christ.
