CITY MANAGER NAMES SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN ARTS COMMISSION INTERIM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Sacramento, CA— City of Sacramento City Manager John Shirey announced today that Public Art Program Director, Shelly Willis, has been appointed to serve as Interim Executive Director for the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission (SMAC). Willis has been with SMAC since early 2008, overseeing one of SMAC's largest programs. "I'm excited to serve in this capacity to build upon previous executive director Rhyena Halpern's achievements and continue to work with the amazing staff here at SMAC."

Willis will fill this role as the City and County of Sacramento begins a formal recruitment process late fall to hire a permanent executive director, which was recently held by Rhyena Halpern who accepted a position with the City of Palo Alto.
