



Chair of Radiology

The Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) invites applicants and nominations for a visionary leader to be the Professor and Chairman of the Department of Radiology. The Department brings together nationally recognized physicians and scientists, state-of-the-art imaging equipment and patient care programs at affiliated, tertiary level care teaching hospitals on the Milwaukee Regional Medical Campus (MRMC). The Department of Radiology delivers world-class diagnostic and interventional radiology services and the faculty radiologists are national leaders in the development and use of imaging technologies. The Radiology Department also participates in collaborative projects with GE Healthcare in the areas of CT, Diffusion-tensor Magnet Resonance, Functional MRI, and the next generation X-Ray room.

The successful candidate will assume leadership of 80 faculty members and has seven direct reports: Division Chiefs of Nuclear Medicine, Medical Physics & Imaging Science, Vascular & Interventional Radiology, Pediatric Radiology, Diagnostic Radiology, and Informatics; the Administrator and dotted line responsibility for the Chief of Radiology at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center. Diagnostic Radiology is subdivided into eight major clinical sections, which are headed by Section Chiefs of Digital Imaging, Thoracic Radiology, Gastrointestinal Radiology, Musculoskeletal Radiology, Genitourinary Radiology, Breast Imaging, Neuroradiology, and General Diagnostic Radiology.

The Department offers a comprehensive accredited four-year residency in Diagnostic Radiology. Additionally, fellowships are offered in digital imaging, vascular interventional radiology, neuroradiology, thoracic imaging, musculoskeletal radiology, breast imaging, pediatric imaging, and pediatric neuroradiology.

The Department of Radiology has a very active research program that has achieved national and international recognition. Areas of active investigation include: multi-detector computed tomography (MDCT), ultrasound contrast agents, functional MRI and MR spectroscopy, and radiology informatics.

Qualifications of candidates:

Candidates should have an MD and/or MD/PhD degree. Desired experiences and skills include:

- National reputation within academic Radiology institutions
- Commitment to scholarship, education, research and clinical service along with having a strong record of achievement in these areas
- Record of innovative and effective administrative and fiscal leadership with skills in personnel management and strategic planning.

The Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) is a private, academic institution dedicated to leadership and excellence. The college educates 816 medical students, 450 graduate students and supervises 900 physicians-in-training in graduate medical education (residency and fellowship training) programs. The college is the nation's 10th largest medical school in terms of enrollment and it provides continuing education to more than 15,000 health professional registrants each year. In July 2007, the Higher Learning Commission notified MCW that the accreditation has been continued for ten years. In FY 2010-11, faculty received more than \$175 million in external support for research, teaching, training and related purposes, of which more than \$161 million was for research. In the federal government's FY 1011, the College received approximately \$92.9 million in NIH funding and ranked 43rd among medical schools

nationwide. Through its clinical operations, MCW providers, physician assistants, nurse practitioners and psychologists care for more than 410,000 patients representing more than 1.7 million patient visits. Medical College of Wisconsin Providers practice at three major affiliates: Froedtert Hospital, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin and the Zablocki VA Medical Center and many other hospitals and clinics in the Milwaukee area.
