

The University of Missouri-Columbia (MU) School of Medicine invites applications and nominations for the position of chair of the Department of Radiology.

The department includes a full complement of radiologists, a highly successful radiology training program and a powerful research program that encompasses nano and molecular medicine. Research is conducted in partnership with MU's Nuclear Research Reactor, the most powerful university reactor in the country and the leading producer of radiopharmaceuticals for biomedical application. The department also operates Missouri Radiology Imaging Center, one of the most advanced resonance imaging facilities in the state. The Diagnostic Radiology residency program at MU offers a clinical and academic experience that is fully accredited by the ACGME. Residents are trained in diagnostic radiology, including plain film diagnosis, ultrasound, computed topography (CT), magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), nuclear medicine, and interventional radiology. The Department of Radiology offers expanded educational opportunities in neuro-interventional and musculoskeletal radiology, mammography, pediatric radiology, and diagnostic radiology. The primary clinical institution is University of Missouri Health Care, which includes Ellis Fischel Cancer Center, but residents also rotate through Harry W. Truman Memorial Veterans' Hospital.

MU is one of the few institutions in the country with colleges of medicine, veterinary medicine, agriculture, engineering, nursing and health professions on one campus. At MU's comprehensive academic medical center, scientists join clinicians in producing lifesaving discoveries and delivering them to patients through a far-reaching network of hospitals, clinics, and telehealth sites. MU has more than 280 degree programs, 34,255 students and 250,000 alumni. The School of Medicine's more than 675 faculty physicians and scientists educate more than 1,000 medical students, residents, fellows and other students seeking advanced degrees.

Applicants should possess leadership skills, management ability and have administrative experience. The individual must have or be able to easily obtain a Missouri medical license, and must be certified by the American Board of Radiology with practice experience. Rank and track will be commensurate with experience. The applicant will be expected to foster collaborative interactions between clinical and basic science faculty members within the department and the School of Medicine, and work constructively with a culturally diverse faculty and student body.
