TTUHSC's Paul L. Foster School of Medicine invites nominations and applications for the position of Department Chair of Internal Medicine. The Chair reports to the Founding Dean of the School of Medicine and also serves in a clinical leadership role at the primary affiliated teaching hospital, University Medical Center of El Paso. This is a unique opportunity for a visionary builder to lead the Department's clinical service, educational, and scholarship missions.

This is an exciting time in the medical school's history as the first class graduates in 2013. The campus is energized by plans to develop an independent health sciences university in El Paso with the newly accredited Gayle Greve Hunt School of Nursing and a planned graduate school of biomedical sciences. The school resides within the Medical Center of the Americas' 440-acre footprint, which has spurred economic development into a world-class medical center serving a major bi-national and military community. The school's clinical practice includes county, private, and state funded hospitals with additional ambulatory practice locations.

The Department has 47 faculty members with resources to recruit additional positions and 85 volunteer community faculty members participating in the educational mission. The ACGME-accredited residency program trains 45 residents. The Department has fellowship programs in Cardiology, GI and Nephrology. The Department of Medicine has 10 divisions: Cardio, Endo, GI, Medicine, Hem/Onc, ID, Neph, Pulm/CC, and Rheum. The Department also has an extramurally-funded research program in GI, nephrology, and oncology.

El Paso is ranked as the #1 safest city in the U.S. Nestled between the base of the Franklin Mountains and the Rio Grande, the city resides at the confluence of three states and two countries. Residents enjoy more than 300 days of sunshine a year, numerous outdoor pursuits, as well as a vibrant city life at an affordable cost of living.

The successful candidate will be an MD/DO clinical educator with ABIM board certification, eligibility for a TX medical license, qualifications for the rank of Associate Professor or higher, 3 years of demonstrated leadership experience, strong interpersonal/leadership skills, a track record of scholarship, and an understanding of the clinical enterprise and promotion of research.

Salary and academic rank are commensurate with qualifications. A comprehensive benefits package is included. Opportunities for joint appointment exist within the Centers of Excellence for Cancer Research, Infectious Diseases, Neurosciences, and/or Diabetes and Obesity.
