The Department of Medicine of UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School in New Brunswick is comprised of approximately 110 paid and over 400 volunteer faculty members organized in 12 divisions covering the major medical subspecialties: Allergy, Immunology and Infectious Diseases; Cardiovascular Diseases and Hypertension; Clinical Pharmacology; Education; Endocrinology, Metabolism and Nutrition; Gastroenterology and Hepatology; General Internal Medicine; Hematology; Medical Oncology; Nephrology; Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine; and Rheumatology and Connective Tissue Research.

As one of the nation's leading comprehensive medical schools, UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School is dedicated to the pursuit of excellence in education, research, health care delivery, and the promotion of community health. In cooperation with Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, the medical school's principal affiliate, they comprise New Jersey's premier academic medical center. In addition, Robert Wood Johnson Medical School has 34 hospital affiliates and ambulatory care sites throughout the region.

As one of the eight schools of the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey with 2,500 full-time and volunteer faculty, Robert Wood Johnson Medical School encompasses 20 basic science and clinical departments and hosts centers and institutes including The Cancer Institute of New Jersey, the Center for Advanced Biotechnology and Medicine, the Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences Institute, and the Stem Cell Institute of New Jersey. The medical school maintains educational programs at the undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate levels for more than 1,500 students on its campuses in New Brunswick, Piscataway, and Camden, and provides continuing education courses for health care professionals and community education programs.

A recent statute, the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act, provides for most schools and units of the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey to be transferred to Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, on July 1, 2013. The integration of these two outstanding universities will build on the rich history, talent, and expertise of both institutions and signals the beginning of a promising era for New Jersey. Joining the strengths and centers of excellence of these universities will enhance collaborative learning and research opportunities and result in a powerful institution that will set a new national standard for medical and health sciences education.
