

Application for the 2013 Student Council Scholarship

Amount: \$1000

Deadline: Friday May 3, 2013

This scholarship is based on the applicant's contributions to Bernards High School. Although extracurricular activities are one way to be involved in BHS, there are also other ways to make a difference in our school. In addition to contributing to BHS, applicants should also have a minimum 2.5 unweighted grade point average.¹ A committee of BHS Student Council members will determine scholarship winners based on these criteria. This scholarship is open only to BHS seniors.

PLEASE INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING WITH THE APPLICATION:

1. A typed essay (maximum 500 words), briefly explaining how you have contributed to the BHS community.
2. A teacher recommendation. This can be written specifically for this scholarship but it can also be a recommendation from a previous application. Teachers may either e mail the recommendation to Ms. Gray (pgray@shsd.org) or give her a hard copy of the recommendation.
3. A table of all activities, positions, community service, etc. at BHS. Include the activity, any offices held, and a brief description of the activity.

Please remember that this scholarship is based entirely on the applicant's impact on BHS. The Student Council will consider not only the number of activities, but also the positive impact the applicant had in those activities. Community service and other activities outside of school are not considered in this scholarship.

Please submit all applications to Ms. Gray by May 3, 2013 in room A 408.

By submitting this application, you attest that you have a minimum 2.5 unweighted GPA. You also agree to allow Student Council to verify any statement or claim made on this application, including your grade point average.

¹ *Applicants:* to find out your unweighted GPA, please see your guidance counselor. By applying for this scholarship, you agree to allow the Student Council to verify with the Guidance Department whether you meet the minimum GPA requirement. It is not necessary to include the GPA with the application. Beyond the minimum requirement, GPA will not be a factor in determining scholarship winners.
