GREENHOUSE GAS REPORTING SERVICES FOR THE OIL AND NATURAL GAS INDUSTRY

Environmental Protection Agency Requirements

Beginning in September of 2012, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) required all oil and natural gas production, processing, transmission, and storage facilities to report greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions with the use of the online Electronic Greenhouse Gas Reporting Tool (e-GGRT). By April 1, 2013, the EPA is requiring all applicable parties in the oil and natural gas industry to submit GHG emissions from the 2012 calendar year with the use of the e-GGRT program. The e-GGRT program is used to help the EPA monitor GHG emissions from a variety of sources. Several other industries that produce greenhouse gases have also been required to submit emission reports through the e-GGRT program. ARM has been involved with the e-GGRT program since its inception, is experienced with the functionality and capabilities of the program, and has been actively providing reporting services for its customers.
