This symposium, in conjunction with the completion of Hesperus Village, aims to bring together artists and community to create a new unification of colour, form and space. By gathering to ensoul this building and by our time and efforts given, we will build social community. Participants may choose between apprenticing in sculpture and lazure using plant pigments, with many hours each day of hands on learning. Our common efforts will be enriched by singing, eurythmy, morning lectures and evening presentations that build on our understanding of 'thresholds'. This symposium will be a gift to the future of Hesperus Village which is dedicated to the continued growth and development of the human being.

Architecture, as manifested by the sacred spaces of the ages, was a marriage of all the arts with the power to bring the human being into a dialogue with the spirit. With the end of the Gothic period came a shattering of this unified art into the separate visual arts of today. Rudolf Steiner, through the buildings he created in Dornach Switzerland, reawakened this knowledge of the power of architecture to support the evolving of human consciousness.

H. S. (Bert) Chase is the architect of Hesperus Village: At an early age Mr.Chase moved from North America to Peru. Surrounded by its rich history and archaeology inspired a lifelong interest in the relationship between architecture and spiritual influences in everyday life. Early in his career he learned of Rudolf Steiner's profound indications for architecture - these changed the course of his life. In 1973 Mr. Chase joined the Emerson College Architect's Group in England, whose work was dedicated to bringing these ideals into contemporary practice. His practice is now based in Vancouver B.C. where he has served anthroposophical initiatives throughout North America and Hawaii over thirty years. Lazure painting can be seen as a 'cultural impulse' with universal implication and application. Not everyone, sometimes even experienced lazurists, fully grasp it's essential principals and importance as a way of transforming interior and exterior spaces through the inner power of colour. It is not meant to merely decorate wall surfaces. Lazure should support spatial function. It can achieve this through color mood and radiant transparency. Lazure when done well, ensouls architectural space with *healing life* helping us breath more harmoniously through colour's innate inner qualities. Thus lazure painting can be seen as a conveyor of beauty aiding personal and social/cultural transformation.
