Ensuring there is accessible transportation for Town sponsored active adult programs is also a goal. Our Town Board liaison is helping us with researching this project.

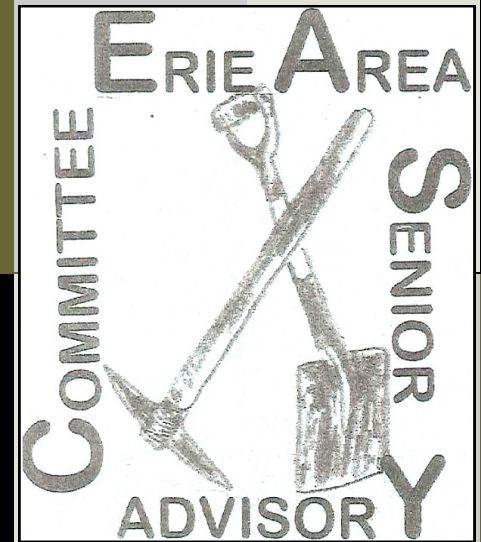

EASY SHARE MENTOR PROGRAM



Study after study has shown the value of one-on-one relationships between adults and children.

During the school year, each mentor will enhance the student's learning skills while fostering a caring relationship. You will discover that the child is not the only one learning.

Mentors commit to a specific time for a minimum of one hour per week.

Mentoring opportunities are available in a variety of areas including; literacy, math and science.

Mentoring opportunities are available at Erie Elementary, Black Rock Elementary and Red Hawk Elementary. These schools are requesting support in grades 3-5.

LOAN CLOSET

This year EASY-C opened a Loan Closet to the Erie Community for temporary help with medical problems.

Each Thursday Weld County Adult Nutrition Program provides lunch at the Erie Community Center. EASY-C has volunteers that pick up donated bakery and grocery items at Safeway and King Soopers. This is a free program for the lunch participants.

With enough volunteers you may only need to do this once a month.
