Physics: Mechanics & States of Matter

Instructor: Schmahl Science (http://www.schmahlscience.org)

Physics and chemistry are traditionally taught in schools as separate subjects. However, these seemingly disparate fields work together to create conduction, solar power, cooking, and electrochemistry. Students will explore the interaction of physics and chemistry as they examine the properties of air in connection to a conduction oven, learn about mass and volume, discover how the Periodic Table goes to work in the kitchen, and construct a fruit-powered battery.

Schmahl Science Workshops EXPLODES the myth that science is dull. Our instructors are talented scientists and engineers who engage students' curiosity, imagination and creativity using a fun, hand-on approach. Students learn to apply the scientific process as well as core scientific principles, all while making exciting new discoveries. All workshops are taught by scientists.

02/08: Balance and Motion - Roller Coaster Science: Students work in groups to make a roller coaster with split foam tubes, marbles, and tape. They discover amazing ways to get as many energy conversions as possible. This relates to potential energy, kinetic energy, friction, and inertia. (Code 35

02/15: Vectors & Velocity: Physics must explain not only why and how much, but also where and which way. Physicists and mathematicians invented a way of describing quantities that have direction as well as magnitude. Velocity describes speed and direction. Vectors, which describe displacement and velocity, are universal for all coordinate systems. Position, forces, motion and balance are all intertwined. We'll use toys, our bodies, ropes, and spring scales to build a mobile to illustrate these principles. (Code 468)

03/01: Balancing Structures: Your aim is to try and make the tallest tower using blocks. Remove blocks from lower down the tower and place them on the top. See how long can you can keep the tower balanced. (Code 328)

03/08: Pencil Trick: If a force is applied to a stable or balanced body or system, the net imbalance in force might cause the body to change position. If the system recovers and returns to its starting position, the system is stable. Students grapple with different kinds of stability as they balance pencils on their points using counter weighting and build mobiles that always return to their balanced positions. (Code 2)

Triangle and Arch: Balance is the everyday word used to describe a state of equilibrium. Students recognize when something is in balance because it doesn't fall over. A physicist would say that a state of equilibrium is reached when the net force acting on a body or system is zero. If there is a strong force pushing one way that is balanced by an equally strong force pushing in the opposite direction, the net force is zero, and a state of equilibrium is achieved. During our workshop, students discover numerous ways to balance two-dimensional shapes made out of tag board. (Code 4)

03/15: Death by Marshmallow: Trebuchets were one of the light artillery weapons used to throw objects into enemy territory in the Middle Ages. Students will build, test, and then modify the throwing distance of a Trebuchet. The objective is to fling a marshmallow the farthest. (Code 119)

03/22: Gadget Anatomy: This lesson teaches students what simple machines are, how they work, and how they are useful in the household. We will be taking apart complex machines like clocks, toasters, and locks in order to discover the simple machines inside them. (Code 49)

03/29: Parachute Design Challenge: Leonardo da Vinci said, "If a man is provided with a length of gummed linen cloth with a length of 12 yards on each side and 12 yards high, he can jump from any great height whatsoever without injury." A simple parachute will land a small payload, but how big a canopy does it take to bring Barbie back down to Earth? We'll make parachutes out of facial tissues and test some larger parachutes and their carrying capacity. (Code 454)

04/05: Orbits: Impact cratering is a process found everywhere in the solar system. Craters are among the most fascinating features of many moons and planets. In this workshop, students experiment to find out more about what causes the various features of impact craters, including the rim of mountains around the edge, and the streaks or rays that fan out from large craters. (Code 42)

04/12: Water Rockets: Better wear your swimsuit to this workshop as students design and launch rockets made from 2-liter bottles. (Code 187)

04/26: Mousetrap Cars Part 1: Many products exist that can be improved. Indeed, technological innovation is often the result of improving on the works of others. Automotive engineers have carefully improved such areas as engine design and aerodynamics to achieve better performance and gas mileage. In this problem situation, the power source for a small toy car is a mousetrap. It is a simple idea with lots of room for improvement. Your challenge is to redesign a mousetrap car so that it will travel the greatest distance possible. (Code 513)

05/03: Mousetrap Cars Part 2: Now the time has come to put your design to the test. How far can it roll using only the energy stored from a mousetrap and your clever new high efficiency design? Not rolling as far as you'd like? Well, now you can redesign again, only this time collaborating with other teams to come up with the ultimate distance mousetrap car! (Code 513)

05/10: Kabroom: Players must catapult a marshmallow from a paper plate into a cup using a broom. (Code 548)

05/17: Rapid Fire: Using only their hands, students must shoot rubber bands and knock a pyramid of six soda cans completely off a platform eight feet away. (Code 556)

05/24: Paper Scraper: Students build a tower of index cards that is 10 levels high. Each level consists of two pre-bent cards with a flat card on top. (Code 554) Did you know that cooking is chemistry in action? Students take over the kitchen in this exciting workshop as they use such uncommon cooking ingredients as liquid nitrogen and air pressure, as well as more common cooking techniques to manipulate states of matter.

05/31: Liquid Nitrogen: Liquid Nitrogen is an extremely cold, liquefied gas. It can be used to demonstrate lots of interesting effects from superconductivity to the properties of gases and liquids, and a whole lot more! We use liquid nitrogen to investigate how cold temperatures affect materials. We also discuss the phases of matter and how the Kinetic Theory of Gases models these phases. (Code 11)

06/07: Countertop Chemistry: Students cook pancakes to learn about the states of matter. They use the microwave to change the state of soap and marshmallows. They are also encouraged to pay attention to the chemistry in everyday cooking. Chemistry is the study of matter and its changes and many of the changes that occur in cooking can be considered a form of chemistry. (Code 231)

06/14: Liquid Investigations: A team of explorers has just returned from the planet Oblickus in the galaxy Whermi. They have brought with them samples of substances they are calling Oobleck and Gloop. Students partner together and are part of a team of scientists who have been given the job of investigating the Oobleck and Gloop so that they can describe the substances to the rest of the world. (Code 97)

This year 3rd and 4th grade theater club offers two options.
