Outdoor Excursion to Point Lobos

12:15 - 5:30pm

Teams must transport their own players. Comfortable walking shoes and a jacket or sweatshirt are recommended.

Load time: Immediately following church

Snack time: 3:30pm at Whalers Cove picnic area, located to the right as you enter

Depart back to MBA: 4:30pm

Driving Directions from MBA: Turn right out of MBA front gate onto **San Andreas Rd.** for 3 Miles, **Left** onto **W Beach St.** for 1.4 Miles, **Right** onto **Lee Rd.** for 0.3 Miles, first **Left** on **W Riverside Dr.** then immediately take **southbound Hwy 1 on-ramp**, travel south on Hwy 1 for 31.1 Miles through Monterey and Carmel. The entrance to Point Lobos is on your right, **just past Riley Ranch Rd.**

-Park on the main road (Hwy 1) and walk in through the main entrance (no entrance fee). For vehicles that drive in the cost is \$10.

-Respect the power of the ocean. No Swimming, including the nearby beaches (dangerous undertow).

-Rock climbing is **ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED**.

-Remain on designated trails, No dogs or any other pets are allowed in reserve

-Do not collect, remove or disturb any natural objects

-No fires, fishing, or recreational games allowed in the reserve. This includes frisbee, skateboarding, softball and kite-flying, etc.

About Point Lobos:

Located off Hwy 1 on the southern edge of Carmel, CA, Point Lobos has been called “the greatest meeting of land and water in the world,” and the “crown jewel of the state park system.” The 14 trails inside the reserve cover more than 6 miles, including one of only 2 natural stands of Monterey Cypress forests in the world.
