Who Attends LGA Programs?

- 2/3 of LGA participants are from government and 1/3 are from private or non-profit organizations; of the public sector participants, 2/3 are elected officials and 1/3 are appointed
- The Newly Elected Officials Course successfully attracts a bipartisan audience, with the most recent course comprised of 45% Democrats, 35% Republicans and 20% Independent or other.
