



# Vehicle parking for Medford HEC Fall, 2012

Several free lots exist close to the center. One merchant trades parking for a cup of coffee. Medford Senior Center has annual permits.



If you can, take the bus. It's a short walk to HEC.

**The free lots:** Evergreen parking structure, 3 hours; Middleford parking structure, 2 hours. At both you can pay by plate (see reverse side) for longer stays. The Library has 1 hour free parking, pay to stay longer.

**Coffee** —Buy a cup at Bad Ass Coffee, 143 S Riverside, and your car can stay two hours.

**Permits** — The City of Medford sells permits for up to 30 days at [www.ci.medford.or.us](http://www.ci.medford.or.us) for the many paid lots around HEC.

The Medford Senior Center, 511 E. Main Street, sells a citypermit with a membership (\$26), and it's good until June 30, 2013. They ask that those NOT coming to the center use the city permit lots at Hawthorne Park or off Almond Street (there's a bridge over the creek)

#### Directions on How to Use Parking Meter

1. Push "Select Rate", 2<sup>nd</sup> button (Please note that the "screen" does not say "hourly", it only says Daily or Weekly. Continue with the following even though it says daily.)
2. Hit Accept button
3. Add time by pushing 3<sup>rd</sup> button, "Add Time"
4. Once you have reached the right amount of time, hit Accept 4<sup>th</sup> button
5. It will ask you for your license number so be prepared when you step up to the machine.
6. It will then ask for your credit card or for you to add coins. The meter only accepts coins no paper money.
7. Once approved, a receipt will be printed to put on your dashboard.
8. Note that this is the same process for a weekly permit.

## **Parking fees can be paid by phone**

Motorists parking in downtown Medford can now pay fees by phone, according to a news release. A free app, PaybyPhone, is available in iPhone, Android and Blackberry markets. Motorists can also use the mobile site [m.paybyphone.com](http://m.paybyphone.com), the website [www.paybyphone.com](http://www.paybyphone.com) or phone at 1-866-234-7275. Users will get a text message when their meter is about to expire, giving them the option to feed it remotely or get back to their vehicle before it runs out.
