## Remembering Logan Wellman

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Logan was born on February 27, 1995 with a Bilateral Cleft Lip and Palate. At the time, Wendy felt lost and overwhelmed and didn't know where to turn. Through researching Logan's condition, Wendy stumbled upon AboutFace, a small charity that provides social and emotional support for people with facial differences and their families. This was exactly what she needed at the time and it was a relief to find an organization that could provide her with the support she was looking for at a difficult time in her life.

"Growing up, Logan lived a very normal life", says Wendy. "He was like any thirteen year old boy his age." Logan enjoyed playing sports such as golf and hockey, snowmobiling, 4-wheeling, building forts, camping and hanging out with his friends.

On Monday, July 28, 2008, an unexpected accident took the young life of Logan after a fatal head injury as a result of bullying. Every year since Logan passed away, Wendy, Logan's mother, has sponsored a child to go to Camp Trailblazers in memory of her son. Though Logan was never able to attend the camp himself, Wendy knows that it would have been an experience he would have loved and benefited from.

Wendy's most vivid memory of her son was his positive outlook on life. Being a young child with a facial difference has its difficulties, especially when it comes to dealing with teasing and bullying. However, Logan never let this affect him emotionally. His brave attitude and good intuition to never act on his anger was one of the things Wendy loved most about her son.

Over the past two years, Logan has been dearly missed by his family and friends, but the memories he's left behind have allowed his loved ones to never forget the lives he's touched.
