Employment Opportunity: Disabilities Project Director

The Disabilities Project Director will have primary responsibility for implementing and coordinating DCADV's new 3 year grant funded Disabilities Project. This three year planning and capacity building project will focus on the needs of victims of intimate partner violence with cognitive and/or mental health disabilities. The statewide project is a collaboration of three partner agencies and will involve intensive consensus building, needs assessment and strategic planning activities. In the planning phase of the project, the Project Director will lead efforts to create multiple grant deliverable documents that will be the products of group collaborative process and which will serve as the basis for local program implementation. Once the planning phase has been completed, the Project Director will manage the implementation of strategic plan initiatives across partner agencies and/or pilot sites.

Qualifications: This position requires strong leadership and project management experience, excellent group facilitation and communication skills, as well as a thorough knowledge and understanding of group process and consensus building. The Director should have a good understanding of nonprofit capacity building and cross discipline collaborations. Experience working in the fields of violence against women and/or disabilities is preferred. The Project Director should possess a strong commitment to cultural diversity, accessibility and ending violence against women. BA/BS in human services or related field required. Writing samples may be requested. Depending on qualifications, position could also include management/supervisory responsibilities.
