All Unborn Children Must Be Acknowledged with Dignity & Worth



For any organization to say abortion is wrong and yet ignore the need to support and grieve the loss of a child because of a miscarriage is hypocrisy. Verbal witness, physical presence and protest marches near abortion facilities and government buildings will never be enough to end abortion.

Authentic witness to the sanctity of life requires mourning the loss of every child's life, regardless of the child's gestational age and whether a child died through a miscarriage (spontaneous/natural abortion) or an abortion (induced/unnatural abortion). Efforts need to be made to provide a respectful burial for all fetal remains, even when they do not provide a resemblance of "child" during 0-20 weeks gestation.

Sadly, many state laws disregard proof of the child's heartbeat and the document recordings of a child's attempt to escape entrapment within the woman before its brutal extraction from the womb. Sadly, many state laws refer to children miscarried between 0 - 20 weeks gestation as fetal material, fetal remains or products of conception. Such state laws provide Planned Parenthood and abortion providers with persuasive rhetoric and propaganda by stating that abortions do not kill babies, they discard fetal material before it becomes a baby.

A farewell ritual and dignified burial is necessary to recognize the life and death of a baby at any age gestation.
