**STATE OF EMERGENCY NOTICE**

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. Sections 14-288.12 and 166A-8, I, J. Alan Holden, Mayor for the Town of Holden Beach, North Carolina, issued a public proclamation declaring to **ALL PERSONS**, the existence of a State of Emergency, and in order to more effectively protect the lives and the property of the people within the Town, do place in effect the following restrictions:

**CURFEW**

A town wide curfew will be in effect starting at 8:00 p.m. on August 26, 2011. The curfew will remain in effect each day thereafter, until such time that the Town of Holden Beach, North Carolina determines that such a curfew is no longer necessary and a proclamation for re-entry is issued. A curfew means people must remain at their domicile.

Only authorized personnel shall be allowed on public streets, spaces and property after 8:00 p.m. on August 26, 2011 until the evacuation process is terminated.

**RESTRICTIONS ON ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**


The possession or consumption of **ANY** alcoholic beverage, including beer, wine, and spirituous liquor other than on one's own premises is hereby prohibited.

**RESTRICTIONS ON POSSESSION, TRANSPORTATION, AND TRANSFER OF DANGEROUS WEAPONS AND SUBSTANCES**

The transportation or possession, or the sale or purchase of any dangerous weapon or substance, while off one's own premises, is prohibited.


This restriction does not apply to any individual or group of people who has the responsibility for the preservation of the public's health, safety, or welfare.

This restriction does not apply to any law enforcement officers, military personnel assigned for hurricane disaster duties, emergency medical personnel, or any other individual or groups of individuals whose job/employment will assist with the public's health, safety, or welfare (i.e. fuel delivery personnel, utility repair personnel, etc.)
