

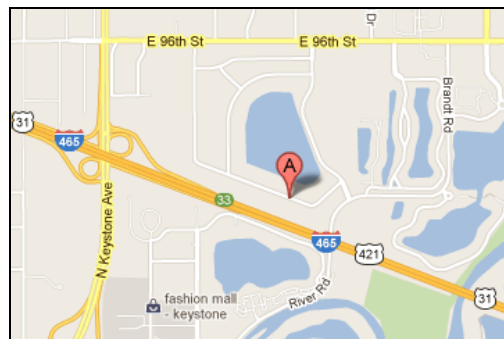

**1:00 PM      Opening session (for all participants)**

*Don't Just Get In; Get Through College.*

Presented by Julie Steck, Ph.D. (Psychologist) and David Parker, Ph.D. (Postsecondary Disability Specialist)

This session will focus on the variety of college options available to students, such as online learning, community colleges, specialized schools, and other choices. Parents and students will be asked to consider key factors to help them objectively evaluate what type of college is right for them.

**2:00 PM      Break-Out Session 1**

Students will attend *Discovering You: Prerequisites for Success*

Presented by Nancy Lindhjem, Ed.S. (School Psychologist)

This session is designed to help students gain a deeper understanding of their personality types and determine how this information can impact learning, relationships, and choice of majors/careers.

Parents will attend *Gear Up for College with Technology for Parents*

Presented by Beth Waite, CCC-SLP/ATP (Assistive Technology Specialist)

Ms. Waite will discuss the difference between assistive technology services in high school and college and recommend questions to ask potential universities about available technology resources. Parents will learn about the pros and cons of using personal technology such as cell phones, iPads, social media, email and other technology to communicate with their college students.

Students will attend *Gear Up for College with Technology for Students*

Presented by Ms. Beth Waite

This session will teach students tips and tricks for using features commonly available in every day technology for writing, reading, studying, independent living and organizing.

Parents will attend *Don't Leave Home Without It: Top 10 Tools for College Success*

Presented by Dr. Parker and Ms. Lindhjem

This session will address key transition skills all students should develop to enhance their independence and success as they begin college. Dr. Parker and Ms. Lindhjem will discuss how parents and educators can help high school students develop these skills and connect with helpful resources on campus.
