

Announcing the 2012 Smith Scholars

The number of scholarship applicants more than doubled compared to the prior year!

In 2012, <u>112</u> JAG seniors submitted their application and documentation to be considered for one of the <u>twelve</u> \$1,000 scholarships awarded in the fourth year of the Board of Directors and Friends of JAG to present scholarships to JAG graduates. The selection committee was most pleased with the overall quality of the applications, transcripts, essays and support letters from the nominees representing nine JAG State Organizations.

- In 2011, <u>53 JAG seniors</u> submitted their application and documentation for one of the <u>ten</u> \$1,000 scholarships awarded in the third year of the KMS Scholarship Fund. The selection committee was most pleased with the overall quality of the applications, transcripts, essays and support letters from the nominees representing 15 JAG State Organizations.
- In 2010, <u>83 JAG seniors</u> submitted their application and documentation for one of the <u>ten</u> \$1,000 scholarships awarded in the second year of awarding scholarships to JAG graduates.
- In 2009, <u>34 JAG seniors</u> submitted their application and documentation for one of the <u>seven</u> \$1,000 scholarships awarded in the initial year of awarding scholarships to JAG graduates.

Snapshots of the 2012 Applicants

In reviewing the applications for the 2012 Smith Scholars, the members of the JAG Scholars and Governance Committees found it most difficult to narrow the 112 applicants to the 12 scholars identified. It was recommended that the Board seeking additional funding to increase the number of scholarships in 2013 and, likewise, we hope that 100 percent of the states will submit nominees for next year's scholarship program.

- The 2012 applicants were requested to share the number of community service hours documented in the 2011-2012 school year. The hours ranged from a low of <u>no</u> documented hours to a high of <u>1,621 hours</u>.
- Applicants' GPA ranged from a low of 1.5 to a high of a 4.0 GPA.
- The percentage of female applicants was 67 percent; male applicants were 33 percent.
- <u>86 percent</u> of applicants were accepted to a postsecondary institution; <u>14 percent</u> of the applicants had not been accepted as of the submission date of the applicant packet.
- <u>63 percent</u> of the 112 applicants are planning to attend a 4-year college or university; <u>30 percent</u> are planning to attend a 2-year community college; <u>3 percent</u> are planning to attend a trade school; and <u>6 percent</u> have not made a decision on their postsecondary destination.
