"Our son, Tom is in the AccessSFUSD transition program which is now located at the Arc. This location provides Tom with additional support services which are specifically geared to people with disabilities. All facilities are fully accessible and Heidi and Ben provide a stimulating learning environment for the students, combining classroom instruction with meaningful work and volunteer assignments geared to each student's interests and capabilities. This has allowed Tom to gain meaningful life and work skills and has increased his sense of independence and confidence in his abilities."

"We are fortunate to have an very positive and collaborative experience and relationship with our daughter's teachers and aides at Tule Elk Park. They go above and beyond the call of duty to ensure she is engaged, nurtured and safe. We love the education and its program. They are truly student-centered/student-focused, taking the time to know my son well, listen to him and introduce him to concepts and experiences that are enjoyable, promote self-esteem and self-development, all the while thinking of the lifelong impact these activities and outings can make.
