About PVI Girls' Basketball

The Paul VI (PVI) High School Girls' Basketball Program has evolved into one of the top programs in the region. The program successfully competes in the nations # 1 ranked Girls Basketball Conference the Washington Catholic School Athletic Conference (WCAC) and in the Virginia Independent Schools Athlete Association (VISAA). PVI teams regularly contend for top positions in the conferences and attract student athletes from across the region. PVI student athletes excel in the classroom and on the basketball court. They receive a well-rounded education from an exceptional high school which fully prepares them for college and beyond.

The PVI girls' basketball program is led by Coach Scott Allen. Coach Allen is entering his tenth season as the Varsity girls' basketball coach. Over the last ten years, Coach Allen has led the Varsity team to seven state championships in the VISAA, including a recent string of five consecutive state championships leading into the 2011-12 season. Coach Allen has also been named VISAA girls' basketball coach of the year an unprecedented five times.

Coach Allen and staff organized the first ever D.C. Metro College Showcase in July 2011. The Showcase served as one of the top college recruiting events for players located on the east coast. More than 98 coaches from across the country came to PVI to evaluate the athletic talent on display. This annual event will continue to grow and expand with the goal of assisting all student-athletes in finding an opportunity to play at the college level.

Coach Allen also organizes the annual Paul VI Girls & Boys Summer Basketball Camps. More than 300 campers over the last nine summers have participated. The camps are designed to improve basketball skills, learn about the game and have fun.

Prior to arriving at PVI, Coach Allen won a Boys Vermont State Title in 1997 and was a coach at the NCAA Division II collegiate level where he was the Men's Assistant Coach for two years at Francis Marion University and the Women's Assistant Coach for two years at Coastal Carolina University, both located in South Carolina.
