K-12 ARTIST TEACHER GREEK ISLAND WORKSHOP

GREECE SUMMER 2013







This exciting Summer Travel Intensive is specifically designed for current and aspiring K-12 art teachers. The 10 day workshop begins in Athens where participants are immersed in Greek art and culture at the acclaimed Acropolis and Benaki Museums, dine in the Plaka district in the vibrant heart of old Athens, and visit many other world heritage sites.

After traveling to the beautiful island of Skiathos via ferry, workshop participants begin their own studio investigations in a retreat-like setting at Studio Mirovili. Situated in a contemporary villa overlooking olive groves and the Aegean Sea, participants employ a choice of basic 2-D media including painting, drawing, printmaking, and digital photography to reinterpret archetypal Greek myths in contemporary and personal terms and as a catalyst for learning in the classroom.

Participants earn 3 undergraduate/graduate credits or equivalent Continuing Education Units with the option of adding an additional 3 credits in Art History.

FACULTY

Lauren Cook: MA in Art Education, MICA; Faculty, Center for Transformative Teaching and Learning, and Head, Visual Art Dept., St. Andrew's Episcopal School, Potomac, MD; Director, Studio Mirovili, Greece; studio artist/painting & mixed media.

Lodging in the heart of Athens and in the traditional section of Skiathos Town, just two kilometers from Studio Mirovili; in-country transportation is provided. Basic 2-D studio facilities and materials provided.
