

Sharon Pandak is a long time Prince William County resident. She devoted 25 years of service to the County and has extensive local government experience. This will be her third time advising a locality on redistricting.



Sharon served as Prince William County Attorney for 15 years. In this role, she advised the Board of County Supervisors on a wide variety of issues including land use, economic development, public safety, emergency services, and social services. Sharon assisted with the creation of the cross-county Parkway, VRE and PRTC, and the historic preservation program. She handled major litigation on behalf of the County. She has worked on issues at the local, state and federal levels.

Sharon served on the Commonwealth Transportation Board and Northern Virginia Transportation Authority as an appointee of Governor Tim Kaine. Governor Mark Warner appointed her to the Local Government Advisory Committee for the Chesapeake Bay.

Sharon serves on the boards of directors of the Prince William Historic Preservation Foundation and Didlake. She is a former board member of the local Habitat for Humanity, the Prince William Symphony and the Partnership & Development Committee of the Hylton Performing Arts Center.

Currently, as partner in the local firm of Greehan, Taves, Pandak & Stoner, PLLC, Sharon represents localities throughout Virginia and other public entities. She is General Counsel to the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments and County Attorney for Orange County.

Sharon was President of the Prince William County Bar Association and the Local Government Attorneys of Virginia. She served as an instructor for the UVA Sorensen Institute of Political Leadership. Sharon considered a campaign for Virginia Attorney General in 2004, and was the Democratic candidate for Chairman of the Board of Supervisors in 2006 and 2007.
